Most teenagers are unclear about their own worldviews, much less someone else's, so they have predictable, good religious questions... such as:

- Where have I come from?
- Where am I going?
- What am I meant to do now?
- How do I find out what's true?
- Hasn't science replaced religion?
- Is God real?
- If so then why is there bad stuff in the world?
- What's the big deal about Jesus?
- Is the Bible reliable?
- Why do Christians have the morals they do?
- What's the most loving thing to do?
- What's Christian worship about?
- Why are there so many denominations?



BUT WHO DARES ANSWER SUCH QUESTIONS?

Usually, teens' unclarity continues.

That's why **WA's School Education Act** provides for an hour per week of Special Religious Education,* yes even, perhaps especially needed, in high school.

* School Education Act 1999, section 69.

Good questions should meet with good answers.

- Clear, concise, yet nuanced, tolerant.
- Grounded in sources, rather than generalisations.
- Informed, representative of the particular worldview.

But **where** can a school find someone willing (even enthused) qualified & **able**, to face such questions?

Right here.

Schedule a rare hour for your students to ask their real questions, and hear some Christian answers.

You might want to come back for seconds.

I encourage you to utilise him as a resource and support person as you seek to further provide opportunities for Secondary students to explore questions of faith.


